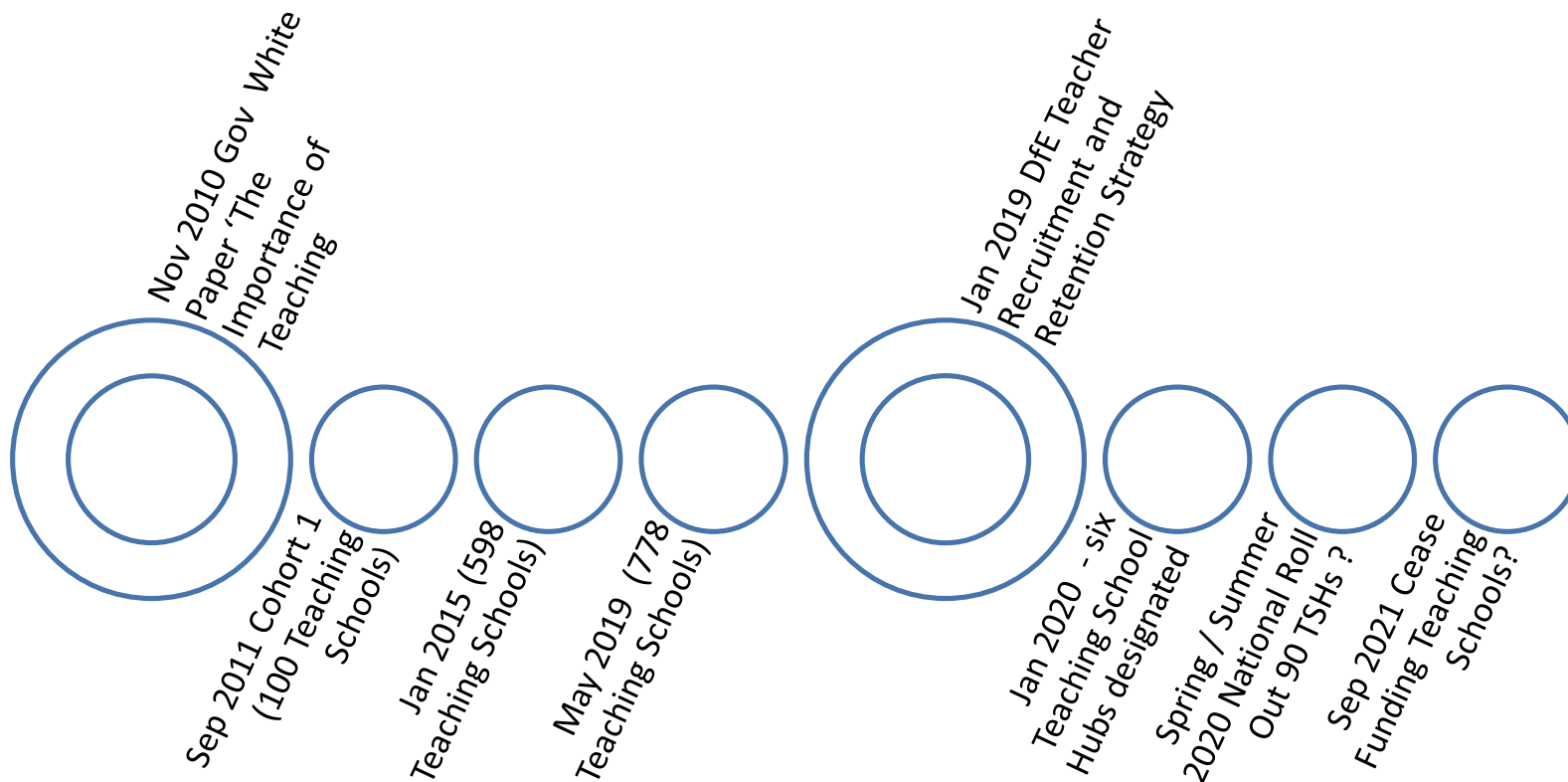

Strengths

- Supporting teacher recruitment
- Increased access to high quality CPD and leadership development
- Value for money
- Supports system leadership
- Created social capital

Limits

- Evidence of impact is patchy
- Uneven coverage
- Without funding, School Improvement limited
- Sense of a cluttered market
- All parts of the system – Curriculum Hubs, Research Schools, SI Offer, MATs – not joined up

Test and Learn Phase

Teaching Schools Vs Teaching School Hubs

- TS and TSH built around ‘big 3’: ITT, CPD and StSS

Important differences

- TSHs have a designated area (made up of Local Authority Districts) – designed to ensure that no ‘cold patches’
- TSHs are larger (200-300 schools) – designed to work at a scale to effect area outcomes
- TSHs have larger grants (min £170k / Year for three years) – give confidence to system
- TSHs have specific KPIs linked to DfE policy aims – new, closer relationship
- TSHs have responsibility for School Improvement Offer: for first time this provides significant and ongoing funding for StSS
- TSHs are expected to work closely with MATs, Curriculum Hubs and Research Schools – the idea is for TSHs to have a ‘multiplying effect’ across the wider system

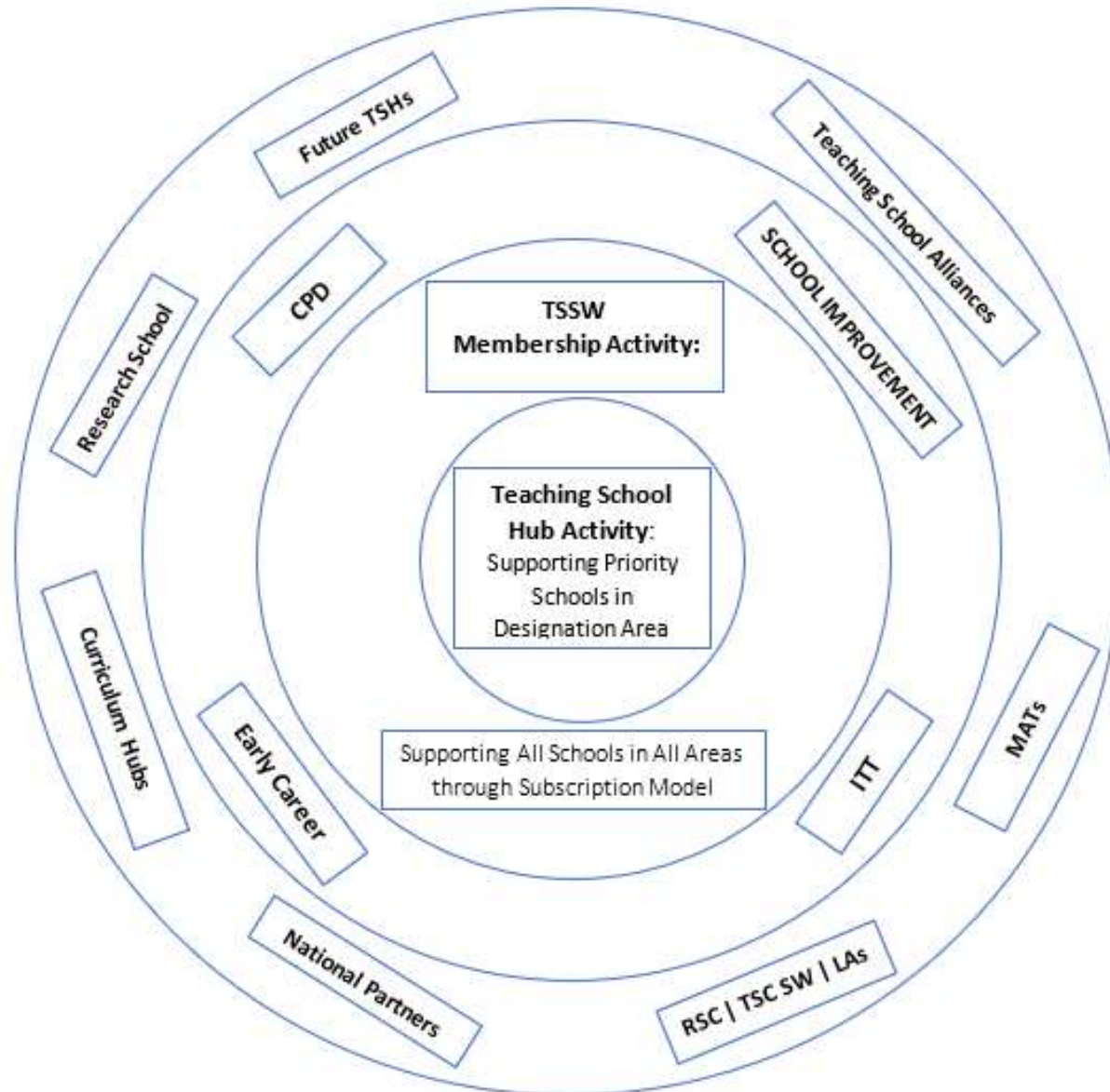

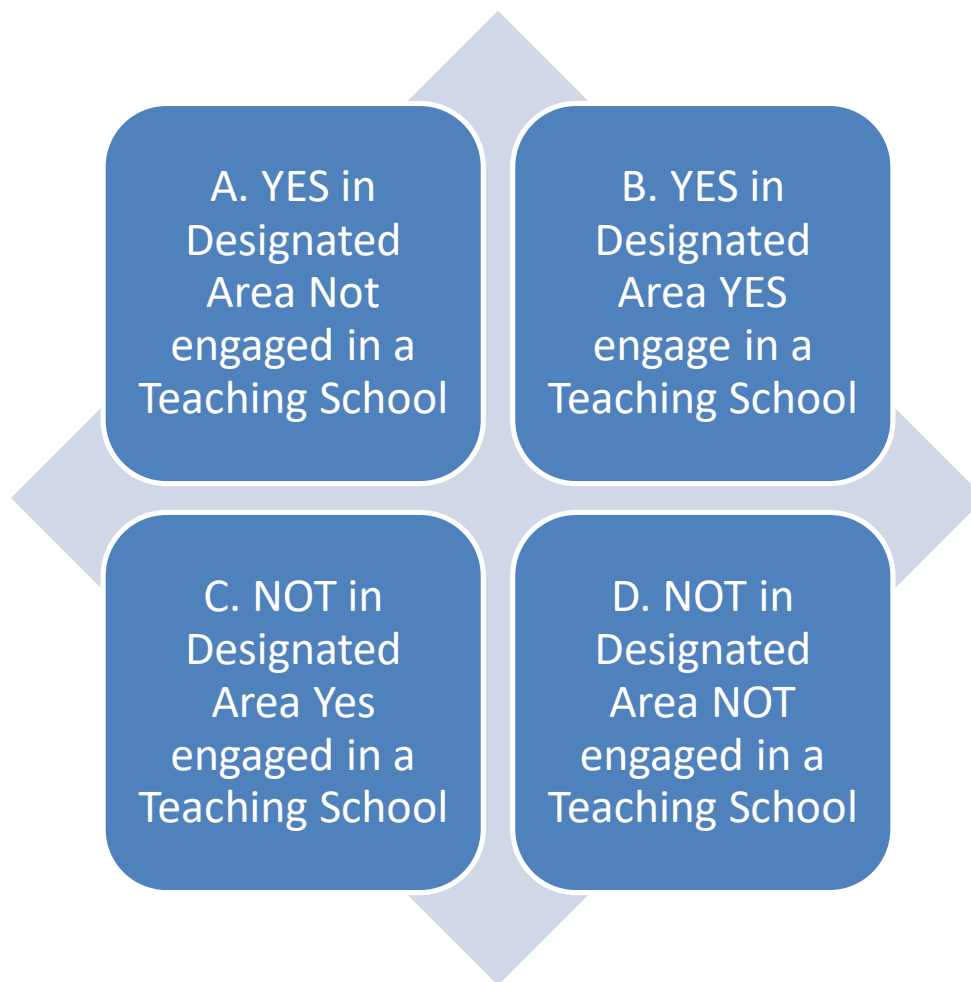

A. YES in Designated Area Not engaged in a Teaching School

Implications are:

- If you are a priority school the School Improvement Offer and other services linked to supporting Priority Schools will come through TSH
- TSH will be able to offer you range of other services (EEF Programmes, DfE Programmes and may lead roll out of Early Career Framework)
- TSH will support partners (such as Curriculum Hubs) to provide support to schools in the Designated Areas

B. YES in Designated Area YES engaged in a Teaching School

Implications are:

- Same as Quadrant A plus the following:
- During the transition period you can continue to access services from your chosen Teaching School
- Funding for Teaching Schools is anticipated to end September 2021 – but not confirmed
- Teaching Schools may have legacy services
- Teaching Schools South West is working towards continuing to offer full range of services beyond September 2021

C. NOT in Designated Area Yes engaged in a Teaching School

Implications are:

- During the transition period you can continue to access services from your chosen Teaching School
- If you are a member of one of Teaching Schools South West partner TSAs then full range of services is available to ALL SCHOOLS in ALL AREAS
- Teaching Schools South West is working towards continuing to offer full range of services beyond September 2021
- National Roll Out of Teaching School Hubs is expected to be announced soon; with this there is likely to be a new TSH with a Designated Area covering Torridge, North Devon, Mid Devon and East Devon before September 2021
- Many of the services delivered by TSH were currently delivered through Teaching School Council – Team South West

D. NOT in Designated Area NOT engaged in a Teaching School

Implications are:

- National Roll Out of Teaching School Hubs is expected to be announced soon; with this there is likely to be a new TSH with a Designated Area covering Torridge, North Devon, Mid Devon and East Devon before September 2021.
- Assuming the National Roll Out takes a similar form to Test and Learn then points from quadrant A of matrix will apply:
 - If you are a priority school the School Improvement Offer and other services linked to supporting Priority Schools will come through TSH
 - TSH will be able to offer you range of other services (EEF Programmes, DfE Programmes and may lead roll out of Early Career Framework)
 - TSH will support partners (such as Curriculum Hubs) to provide support to schools in the Designated Areas
